Endorses Allison McGahay for Supreme Court Justice**

McGahay Earns Major Labor Endorsement Ahead of Labor Day Commemorations

Gouverneur, NY: The Executive Committee and members of the Central Trades and Labor Council met in Gouverneur, St Lawrence County on August 31st, 2022, to endorse candidates for Supreme Court in the 4th Judicial District. The Executive Committee endorsed St. Lawrence County native and Lake Placid resident Allison McGahay for Supreme Court Justice of the 4th Judicial District. The Central Trades and Labor Council represents many members from the Autoworkers, Steelworkers, Carpenters, Bricklayers and Electricians Union as well as others.

“I am honored and grateful to have earned the endorsement from the Executive Committee and will work intently every day to fulfill their trust in my candidacy,” said Allison McGahay. “Growing up in the Massena area, every aspect of our lives was impacted by Union labor. My grandfather was a member of the Union at the Alcoa plant in the 1950’s and my mother and grandmother both retired as members of the New York State United Teachers Union. I am proud to stand with Labor and proud of this endorsement,” said McGahay. “As a longtime Essex County public servant, first as an Assistant District Attorney and former Commissioner of the Board of Elections, I am committed to honoring tradition and returning a Supreme Court Justice to Essex County and the North Country.”

The 4th JD encompasses eleven (11) Counties from Saratoga County to the Canadian Border north and from Washington County, west to Fulton County. With over 500,000 registered voters, and a population of over 840,00 residents, the 4th JD is one of the largest judicial districts in New York State.

Essex County had a seated Supreme Court Judge for close to 100 years until 2008 when the incumbent Essex County Supreme Court Justice was defeated.

Concluded McGahay, “In public service, I have always used the law to protect the vulnerable and the innocent. As a justice of the Supreme Court, I will be a justice for all the people. I am grateful to Ron McDougall, President of the Council and to all the Executive Committee and Union Members that make up the Trades and Labor Council.”
